1875 - 1975

1875

Three Sisters of Charity of Providence founded St. Joseph, the first school

1876

The first convent erected in Yakima (Now Union Gap)

1877

The first public school was founded.

1887

The Sisters moved to North Yakima (Now Yakima) from Yakima (Now Union Gap) and began to build a convent and boarding school (St. Joseph Academy).

1903

First graduating class from St. Joseph Academy.

1918

Jesuits founded Marquette, a high school and shared the building with the grade school students.

1947

St. Joseph Grade School was erected as a Co-ed Catholic School.

1961

Parish Convent built.

1968/69

Consolidated St. Joseph Academy, Marquette High and Central Catholic School to Carroll High School in the Central Catholic School Complex and closed the Academy and Marquette.
